Position Description

This is a temporary, unpaid, law internship for a U.S. Court of Federal Claims Judge. Expected internship tenure is from January through early May 2020. This is a part-time position, at least two full days per week are required, with preference to interns who can work more.

Duties include conducting legal research; writing bench memoranda; and drafting Court orders and opinions on a variety of legal issues. Duties may also include attendance at hearings, trials, and status conferences. Effective interaction with members of the Bar, Clerk's Office staff, and Chambers' staff is essential to this position. In addition, the intern will have the opportunity to attend oral arguments and observe the workings of a U.S. Federal Court.

Qualifications

Candidates must be in their second or third year of law school. Applicants are expected to possess excellent analytical, research, writing, proofreading, communication, and interpersonal skills, and be able to work independently.

The applicant must be a U.S. citizen or otherwise eligible for federal employment within the United States.

Benefits

This is a non-paying position, although transit subsidies are available for eligible interns. No civil service or other benefits are available. Interns are responsible for coordinating any course work credit with their respective schools. Interns will be evaluated by the Judge based upon performance of assigned responsibilities.

Miscellaneous

Due to the expected volume of applications received, the Court will only communicate with those individuals who will be interviewed for the position.
