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## DECISION AWARDING ATTORNEYS' FEES AND COSTS <sup>1</sup>

On March 31, 2013, petitioner filed an unopposed motion for award of final attorneys' fees and reimbursement of costs in this case. Respondent's counsel had certain objections to petitioner's request for fees and costs. Petitioner agreed to reduce the request to an amount of \$10,480.29 for attorney fees and \$120.00 for attorney costs for a total amount of \$10,600.29 for attorney fees and costs. In lieu of filing a Vaccine General Order #9 statement, petitioner's counsel represented to the court on April 17, 2013, that he will reimburse petitioner any costs that petitioner personally incurred that are compensable under § 15 (e)(1). On April 17, 2013, respondent's counsel informed the court that respondent does not object to an award of fees and costs in these amounts.

In accordance with Vaccine Rule 18(b), a party has 14 days to identify and move to delete medical or other information, that satisfies the criteria in 42 U.S.C. § 300aa-12(d)(4)(B). Further, consistent with the rule requirement, a motion for redaction must include a proposed redacted decision. If, upon review, I agree that the identified material fits within the requirements of that provision, I will delete such material from public access.

**The request for attorneys' fees and costs is granted.** Petitioner is awarded reasonable attorneys' fees and costs pursuant to §§ 15(b) and (e)(1), as I find that the petition was brought in good faith and upon a reasonable basis, and the amounts requested are reasonable and appropriate.

**Pursuant to §15(e), I award a lump sum of \$10,600.29<sup>2</sup> to be paid in the form of a check payable jointly to the petitioner and petitioner's law firm, Shoemaker and Associates.**

In the absence of a timely-filed motion for review filed pursuant to Appendix B of the Rules of the U.S. Court of Federal Claims, the Clerk of the court shall enter judgment in accordance herewith.<sup>3</sup>

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<sup>2</sup> This amount is intended to cover all legal expenses incurred in this matter. This award encompasses all charges by the attorney against a client, "advanced costs" as well as fees for legal services rendered. Furthermore, § 15(e)(3) prevents an attorney from charging or collecting fees (including costs) that would be in addition to the amount awarded herein. See generally Beck v. Sec'y of Dep't Health and Human Services, 924 F.2d 1029 (Fed. Cir.1991).
