FINAL ORDER

On September 18, 2019, the Supreme Court of New York, Appellate Division, Second Judicial Department issued an Opinion and Order temporarily suspending Jeffrey S. Lisabeth from the practice of law for two years, effective October 18, 2019. *See In the Matter of Jeffrey S. Lisabeth*, Docket No. 2017-11266 (N.Y. 2019). Mr. Lisabeth notified the Court of his suspension by the Appellate Division of the Supreme Court of New York on October 7, 2019, outside of the 14-day notice period required by Rule 83.2(e) of the Rules of the United States Court of Federal Claims (“RCFC”).

Mr. Lisabeth has been a member of this Court’s bar since March 15, 1996, and has no pending cases. Under RCFC 83.2(c)(2), an attorney admitted to practice before this Court may be disciplined on the grounds of an act or omission that results in the disbarment or suspension of the attorney by another court. In addition, under Rule 83.2(c)(4), an attorney may be disciplined on the grounds of failure to comply with the terms of Rule 83.2, including failure to notify the Court in accordance with Rule 83.2(e).

On March 5, 2020, the Court issued an order directing Mr. Lisabeth to show cause within 30 days why the Court should not impose a reciprocal suspension of two years from the practice of law before the United States Court of Federal Claims. ECF No. 3. The Order to Show Cause further stated that if no response was received, Mr. Lisabeth would be suspended from practice. *Id.* To date, Mr. Lisabeth has not responded to the Order to Show Cause. Therefore,

IT IS ORDERED that Jeffrey S. Lisabeth shall be suspended from the practice of law before the United States Court of Federal Claims for two years, effective, *nunc pro tunc*, October 18, 2019, the effective date of his suspension in New York. The filing of any petition for reinstatement will be governed by Rule 83.2(k)(1).
