FINAL ORDER

David Harris Miller was convicted of serious crimes as defined by Rule 83.2(b)(2) of the Rules of the United States Court of Federal Claims (“RCFC”) and judgment was entered on January 24, 2020. On February 21, 2020, the Virginia State Bar Disciplinary Board (“Board”) issued an Order summarily revoking David Harris Miller’s license to practice law following his criminal conviction. *See In the Matter of David Harris Miller*, VSB Docket No. 20-000-117085 (Va. 2020). Mr. Miller did not report to this Court his conviction or the revocation of his license by the Board as required by Rule 83.2(e).

Mr. Miller has been a member of this Court’s bar since April 30, 1992 and has no pending cases. Under RCFC 83.2(c)(1), an attorney admitted to practice before this Court may be disciplined on the grounds of the conviction by another court of a serious crime. Disbarment is the presumed discipline for the conviction by another court of a serious crime. RCFC 83.2(g)(7)(A). Mr. Miller also failed to notify this Court of his conviction and suspension, which is a violation of RCFC 83.2(e)(1)(A) and (B), and is additional ground for discipline under RCFC 83.2(c)(4).

On March 31, 2020, the Court issued an order directing Mr. Miller to show cause within 30 days why he should not be disbarred from practice before the United States Court of Federal Claims. ECF No. 5. The Order to Show Cause further stated that if no response was received, Mr. Miller would be permanently disbarred from practice. *Id.* To date, Mr. Miller has not responded to the Order to Show Cause. Therefore,


IT IS ORDERED that David Harris Miller shall be permanently disbarred from the practice of law before the United States Court of Federal Claims, effective, *nunc pro tunc*, January 24, 2020, the date judgment entered on his criminal conviction. *See* RCFC 83.2(h)(2). The filing of any petition for reinstatement will be governed by RCFC 83.2(k)(1).
