FINAL ORDER

On August 12, 2020, the Supreme Court of California revoked Peter Miles Hoffman's license to practice law. *See In re Peter Miles Hoffman*, SBC-17-O-02657, -03006, and -000833 (Ca. 2020). Mr. Hoffman did not report to this Court this revocation as required by Rule 83.2(e) of the Rules of the United States Court of Federal Claims ("RCFC"). The Court learned of Mr. Hoffman's revocation on November 25, 2020.

Mr. Hoffman has been a member of this Court's bar since June 21, 1984 and has no pending cases. Under Rule 83.2(c)(2), an attorney may be disciplined on the grounds of an act or omission that results in the disbarment or suspension of the attorney by another court. In addition, under Rule 83.2(c)(4), an attorney may be disciplined on the grounds of failure to comply with the terms of Rule 83.2, including failure to notify the Court in accordance with Rule 83.2(e).

On January 28, 2021, the Court issued an order directing Mr. Hoffman to show cause within 30 days why he should not be disbarred from the practice of law before the United States Court of Federal Claims. ECF No. 3. The Order to Show Cause further stated that if no response was received, Mr. Hoffman would be permanently disbarred from practice. *Id.* To date, Mr. Hoffman has not responded to the Order to Show Cause. Therefore,

IT IS ORDERED that Peter Miles Hoffman shall be disbarred from the practice of law before the United States Court of Federal Claims, *nunc pro tunc*, as of November 25, 2020, the date this Court received notice of the revocation of his license to practice law in California. The filing of any petition for reinstatement will be governed by RCFC 83.2(k)(1).
