In re: William Dell Outman, II

FINAL ORDER

On July 15, 2021, the District of Columbia Court of Appeals issued an order disbarring on consent William Dell Outman, II, from the practice of law in the District of Columbia. *See In Re William D. Outman, II*, Docket No. 21-BG-426 (D.C. 2021). Mr. Outman did not report to this Court his consensual disbarment within 14 days as required by Rule 83.2(e)(1)(C) of the Rules of the United States Court of Federal Claims (“RCFC”).

Mr. Outman has been a member of this Court’s bar since February 22, 1996 and has no pending cases. Under RCFC 83.2(c)(3), an attorney may be disciplined on the grounds of disbarment on consent or resignation from the bar of another court while investigation into an allegation of misconduct is pending.

On September 8, 2021, the Court issued an order directing Mr. Outman to show cause within 30 days why he should not be reciprocally disbarred from the practice of law before the United States Court of Federal Claims. ECF No. 4. Mr. Outman submitted his response to the Order to Show Cause on October 4, 2021. ECF No. 6. Therefore,

IT IS ORDERED that William Dell Outman, II, shall be disbarred from the practice of law before the United States Court of Federal Claims, effective, *nunc pro tunc*, July 15, 2021, the date of his disbarment in the District of Columbia. The filing of any petition for reinstatement will be governed by RCFC 83.2(k)(1).
