FINAL ORDER

On September 7, 2021, the Virginia State Bar Disciplinary Board issued a Consent to Revocation Order revoking Ellen Mary Lynch's license to practice law. *See In the Matters of Ellen Mary Lynch*, VSB Docket Nos. 18-051-112300, 21-000-122407 (Sept. 7, 2020). Ms. Lynch did not report the revocation of her license to this Court as required by Rule 83.2(e)(1)(C) of the Rules of the United States Court of Federal Claims ("RCFC").


Ms. Lynch has been a member of this Court's bar since June 7, 2007 and has no pending cases. Under RCFC 83.2(c)(3), an attorney may be disciplined on the grounds of disbarment on consent or resignation from the bar of another court while investigation into an allegation of misconduct is pending.

On October 26, 2021, the Court issued an order directing Ms. Lynch to show cause within 30 days why she should not be reciprocally disbarred from the practice of law before the United States Court of Federal Claims. ECF No. 3. To date, Ms. Lynch has not responded to the Order to Show Cause. Therefore,

IT IS ORDERED that Ellen Mary Lynch shall be disbarred from the practice of law before the United States Court of Federal Claims, effective, *nunc pro tunc*, September 7, 2021, the date of the revocation of her license by the Virginia State Bar Disciplinary Board. The filing of any petition for reinstatement will be governed by RCFC 83.2(k)(1).
