In re: Lawrence D. O'Neill

FINAL ORDER

On February 3, 2021, the District of Columbia Court of Appeals issued an order suspending Lawrence D. O'Neill from the practice of law in the District of Columbia. *See In Re Lawrence D. O'Neill*, Docket No. 20-BS-702 (D.C. 2021). Mr. O'Neill did not report to this Court his suspension as required by Rule 83.2(e) of the Rules of the United States Court of Federal Claims ("RCFC").

Mr. O'Neill has been a member of this Court's bar since June 9, 1983 and has no pending cases. Under RCFC 83.2(c)(2), an attorney may be disciplined on the grounds of an act, omission, or impairment that results in the disbarment or suspension of the attorney by another court. In addition, under RCFC 83.2(c)(4), an attorney may be disciplined on the grounds of failure to comply with the terms of RCFC 83.2, including failure to notify the Court in accordance with RCFC 83.2(e).

On April 19, 2021, the Court issued an order directing Mr. O'Neill to show cause within 30 days why he should not be reciprocally suspended from the practice of law before the United States Court of Federal Claims. ECF No. 3. The Order to Show Cause further stated that if no response was received, Mr. O'Neill would be indefinitely suspended from practice. *Id.* To date, Mr. O'Neill has not responded to the Order to Show Cause. Therefore,


IT IS ORDERED that Lawrence D. O'Neill shall be indefinitely suspended from the practice of law before the United States Court of Federal Claims, *nunc pro tunc*, February 3, 2021, the date of his suspension in the District of Columbia. The filing of any petition for reinstatement will be governed by RCFC 83.2(k)(1).
