FINAL ORDER

On February 2, 2022, the United States District Court for the Eastern District of Michigan entered an order suspending David A. Reams from the practice of law before the United States District Court and the United States Bankruptcy Court for the Eastern District of Michigan. *In re David A. Reams* (P 62855), Misc. No. 22-50107. Mr. Reams notified the Court of the suspension on February 14, 2022.


Mr. Reams has been a member of this Court's bar since December 29, 2020 and has no pending cases. Under Rule 83.2(c)(2) of the Rules of the United States Court of Federal Claims ("RCFC"), an attorney admitted to practice before this Court may be disciplined for an act or omission that results in the attorney's disbarment or suspension by another court.

On July 22, 2022, the Court issued an order directing Mr. Reams to show cause within thirty (30) days why he should not be suspended from the practice of law before the United States Court of Federal Claims. ECF No. 3. The Order to Show Cause further stated that if no response was received, Mr. Reams would be indefinitely suspended from practice before the Court. *Id.* To date, Mr. Reams has not responded to the Order to Show Cause. Therefore,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that David A. Reams shall be indefinitely suspended from the practice of law before the United States Court of Federal Claims effective, *nunc pro tunc*, February 2, 2022, the date of his suspension by the Eastern District of Michigan. The filing of any petition for reinstatement will be governed by RCFC 83.2(k)(1).
