FINAL ORDER

On June 15, 2022, the Virginia State Bar Disciplinary Board entered an order revoking Mark Edward Kellogg's license to practice law. *In the Matter of Mark Edward Kellogg*, VSB Docket No. 20-051-117703 (Va. 2022). Mr. Kellogg notified this Court of the revocation of his license, as is required by Rule 83.2(e)(1)(B) of the Rules of the United States Court of Federal Claims ("RCFC"), on July 18, 2022.

Mr. Kellogg has been a member of this Court's bar since May 11, 1995 and has no pending cases. Under RCFC 83.2(c)(2), an attorney admitted to practice before this Court may be disciplined for an act or omission that results in the attorney's disbarment or suspension by another court.


On August 17, 2022, the Court issued an order directing Mr. Kellogg to show cause within 30 days why he should not be reciprocally disbarred from the practice of law before the United States Court of Federal Claims. ECF No. 3. The Order to Show Cause further stated that if no response was received, Mr. Kellogg would be disbarred from practice before this Court. *Id.* To date, Mr. Kellogg has not responded to the Order to Show Cause. Therefore,

IT IS ORDERED that Mark Edward Kellogg is disbarred from the practice of law before the United States Court of Federal Claims *nunc pro tunc*, beginning on July 18, 2022, the date this Court received notice of the revocation of his license in Virginia. The filing of any petition for reinstatement will be governed by RCFC 83.2(k)(1).




