FINAL ORDER

On June 23, 2022, the Circuit Court for the City of Staunton entered an order suspending, with terms, Dale Reese Jensen’s license to practice law in the Commonwealth of Virginia for 60 days, beginning August 1, 2022. *Virginia State Bar ex rel. Eighth District Committee*, Case No. CL21-653. Mr. Jensen did not notify the Court of his suspension in Virginia as required by Rule 83.2(e)(1)(C) of the Rules of the United States Court of Federal Claims (“RCFC”).

Mr. Jensen has been a member of this Court’s bar since April 6, 2016 and has no pending cases. Under Rule 83.2(c)(2), an attorney admitted to practice before this Court may be disciplined for an act or omission that results in the attorney’s disbarment or suspension by another court. In addition, under Rule 83.2(c)(4), an attorney may be disciplined on the grounds of failure to comply with the terms of Rule 83.2, including failure to timely notify the Court in accordance with Rule 83.2(e).


On December 8, 2022, the Court issued an order directing Mr. Jensen to show cause within thirty (30) days why he should not be suspended from the practice of law before the United States Court of Federal Claims. ECF No. 3. The Order to Show Cause further stated that if no response was received, Mr. Jensen would be indefinitely suspended from practice before the Court. *Id.* To date, Mr. Jensen has not responded to the Order to Show Cause. Therefore,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that Dale Reese Jensen shall be indefinitely suspended from the practice of law before the United States Court of Federal Claims effective, *nunc pro tunc*, August 1, 2022, the effective date of his suspension in Virginia. The filing of any petition for reinstatement will be governed by RCFC 83.2(k)(1).
