FINAL ORDER

On June 1, 2022, the Supreme Court of California entered an order disbaring Thomas Vincent Girardi from the practice of law in that state. *In re Thomas Vincent Girardi on Discipline*, SBC-21-O-30192 (Ca. 2022). Mr. Girardi did not notify this Court of his disbarment as is required by Rule 83.2(e)(1)(B) of the Rules of the United States Court of Federal Claims (“RCFC”). The Court learned of Mr. Girardi’s disbarment on September 23, 2022.


Mr. Girardi has been a member of this Court’s bar since August 22, 2006, and has no pending cases. Under RCFC 83.2(c)(2), an attorney admitted to practice before this Court may be disciplined for an act or omission that results in the attorney’s disbarment or suspension by another court. In addition, under RCFC 83.2(c)(4), an attorney may be disciplined on the grounds of failure to comply with the terms of RCFC 83.2, including failure to notify the Court in accordance with RCFC 83.2(e).

On October 14, 2022, the Court issued an order directing Mr. Girardi to show cause within 30 days why he should not be reciprocally disbarred from the practice of law before the United States Court of Federal Claims. The Order to Show Cause further stated that if no response was received, Mr. Girardi would be disbarred from practice. To date, Mr. Girardi has not responded to the Order to Show Cause. Therefore,

IT IS ORDERED that Thomas Vincent Girardi is disbarred from the practice of law before the United States Court of Federal Claims effective, *nunc pro tunc*, September 23, 2022, the date this Court received notice of his disbarment in California. The filing of any petition for reinstatement will be governed by RCFC 83.2(k)(1).
